

Scripture Reference	Feast	Date: Modern (Hebrew)	Event
John 2:13—3:21	Passover, Unleavened Bread	April 10-17, 27 A.D. (Nisan 14-21)	Jesus cleanses Temple; meets privately with Nicodemus
John 5:1-47	Pentecost	June 1, 27 A.D. (Sivan 7)	Jesus heals impotent man; confronts Judean leaders who want to kill him
John 6:4 (omitted in two late Greek manuscripts)	Memorial of Blowing of Trumpets? Tabernacles being “nigh”? Wood Offering?	August 7, 27 A.D. (Ab 15)	Jesus does <i>not</i> go to Jerusalem; feeds about 5,000 men plus others
John 7:10—10:21	Tabernacles	October 4-11, 27 A.D. (Tishri 15-22)	Jesus foretells of the gift of holy spirit; declares the truth; heals a man born blind; teaches that he is the good shepherd
John 10:22-39	Dedication	December 13-20, 27 A.D. (Kislev 25 – Tebeth 2)	Jesus claims that he is the Christ and that he does the works of God, his Father
John 19:16-42	Passover	April 28, 28 A.D. (Nisan 14)	Jesus crucified; put in sepulcher by Joseph; embalmed by Nicodemus and put back in sepulcher
Acts 2:1-41	Pentecost	June 20, 28 A.D. (Sivan 8)	Apostles born again and speak in tongues; lead about 3,000 into the new birth
